This week we were informed that the hard work and technology expertise of Year 6 and Mrs. Manning has been recognised with an award for the learning resource they created as part of the DET 2010 Learning Resource Awards. This competition showcases the abilities of students to use a variety of technologies to create a learning resource based on the syllabus studies they are currently engaged in. Year 6 students' entry was based on their studies of simple machines which is part of the Science and Technology curriculum. **Congratulations to all Year 6 students and their teachers!** Mrs. Gorton will inform parents and students of the arrangements for the presentation ceremony which is to be held at the Powerhouse Museum, Ultimo on 19th November.

Year 6 students reported an excellent day at Dungog High on Tuesday as part of the **'Jumpstart' orientation program**. This will be followed with a further high school visit on 2nd December to fully familiarise our students with their new learning environment for 2011.

Our school leaders will be representing the school at the Remembrance Day service at Clarence Town next Thursday. We will also observe this at 11 o'clock at school.

SPEEDING – IS IT WORTH THE RISK?

In NSW speeding is a factor in about 40% of road deaths.

The risk of a crash when driving at 68km/h in a 40km/h school zone is the same as driving with a blood alcohol level of 0.12

Most people know the risk with drink driving and choose not to risk it, but they will take the same risk by choosing to speed.

Less than 5% of pedestrians hit at 30km/h are fatally injured.

Over 90% of pedestrians hit at 60km/h will die.

<u>SLOW DOWN</u> and protect our children in residential areas and near schools. <u>THINK</u> about the consequences.


Family Diet Quality Study Newcastle University

Researchers at the University of Newcastle are studying Family Diet Quality. They are looking for parents/care givers with a child between the ages of 8-12 to answer questions about their usual food intake and physical activity levels. The parent and child will be required to attend the University on two occasions over a 5 month period to have body composition and health measures taken.

Between visits you will be required to measure usual food intake, and parents only will then have a blood test at the end of the study. A small contribution for travel costs is provided.
