

#### **Principal's Report**

Congratulations must go to our school leaders for organising and running our school assemblies. We are using a microphone and have formalised the format of the assemblies. Our students will be able to practise their public speaking skills during the presentation of assembly as well as listening skills as an audience.

We are focussing on personal organisation skills this term and would ask that parents become involved in this as well. This means students come to school, on time, dressed in full school uniform, wearing a jumper and hat and bringing all the equipment they need for the day. It is the season for colds and we have had several outbreaks of heavy colds already this term. Your child needs to be dressed accordingly, even if they don't feel the cold, they may need a jumper or coat later in the day. I would also really appreciate donations of a box of tissues from each family to supplement our supplies at school.

3 way interviews will be held during the last week of school this term, during which your child will be able to talk about their work with both parents and teacher. Reports will go home on the Monday (27th June) of that week, when a separate note will go home with interview details and a return slip for you to complete.

I will also be inviting parents to contribute to the annual school review soon as we are in the process of planning for the next 3 year cycle. I would love to have everyone's input to ensure we are designing the best strategy for the students in our school. I will discuss this next week at our P&C meeting and I invite you all to come and contribute to the meeting.

Next Friday I will be at our local LMG meeting where organisation of local school community initiatives will be discussed and planned.
