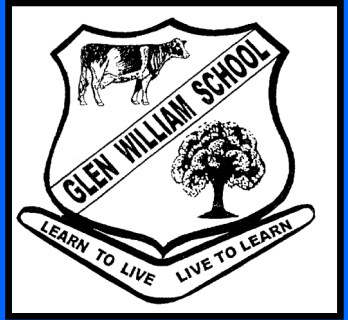

Students from Martins Creek joined us this week for another Musica Viva performance.

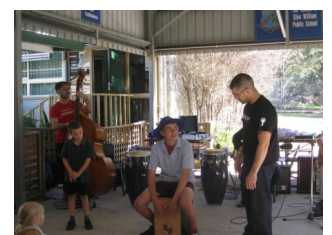


This time a group called 'Tigramuna' played for the students.
