




Our Year 5 and 3 students have successfully participated in NAPLAN for 2021. Well done on your individual resilience to complete the tests to the best of your ability. Reports for these will be forwarded to the school late August or early September. When the school receives these reports we will forward the parent copy home.

This week Mrs Hurney and myself participated in Connecting 2 Country Professional Learning. As a part of our strategic plan, and the NSW Department of Education newly formed partnership with the NSW Aboriginal Education Consultative Group we agree to use our best endeavours to ensure every Aboriginal child and young person in NSW achieves potential through education. The educational outcomes for Aboriginal children and young people will be as good as or better than those of the general student population of New South Wales.

The NSW AECG will support these endeavours by providing appropriate cultural and community knowledge and understandings to teachers and other education staff through professional learning. Miss Parr and Miss Anderson have already completed this training. What we will see as a result of this professional learning;

- ⇒ GWPS will demonstrate that they value the identity, culture, heritage and languages of their Aboriginal students.
- ⇒ Staff will demonstrate that they respect the identity, culture, heritage and languages of their Aboriginal students.
- ⇒ Staff will demonstrate that they believe the parents of Aboriginal students have high aspirations for their children; and that they believe the Aboriginal students they teach are able to achieve their aspirations.
- ⇒ Aboriginal students find schools to be engaging, culturally safe places to learn.
- ⇒ Aboriginal students believe that they can succeed at school and they do succeed.
- ⇒ Aboriginal students are confident in their heritage, cultures and languages.
- ⇒ Every student in NSW understands the heritage and culture of the Aboriginal Peoples on whose land/s they live.
- ⇒ Every student in NSW leaves school with an understanding of Aboriginal heritage and culture and the history of the interaction between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Peoples.
