Any new volunteers will need to complete our school induction. Please see the ladies in the office. All volunteers will need to show proof of their vaccination status.

PBL- Positive Behaviour For Learning

The PBL program sees our students work towards being able to self regulate their own behaviour in a positive manner in school and in the wider community. Students who excel and are consistently demonstrating school values and expectations are presented with a milk carton and these cartons go into their crate. Awards are presented to students who fill their crate. The following will outline the journey to receiving our school PBL medallion.

- ◆ 1 full crate= PBL Award (Bronze)
- 10 Bronze PBL Awards= Principals Award-New level
- ◆ 1 full crate= PBL Award (Silver)
- 10 Silver PBL Awards= Principals Award- New level
- 1 full crate= PBL Award (Gold)= Principals Award
- 3 principals Awards= Medallion

Students are to keep their PBL Awards in their Blue PBL folder. Once they have 10 awards they can hand these into the teacher to signify their next award. It is your child's responsibility to keep track of their PBL awards so they can receive the correct award.



When your child receives a Principals award, they will have a special lunch provided.

Hats NO Play

Our school sun safety policy incorporates a no hat, no play policy. All students must wear a hat while on the playground.

Shoelaces

Children should learn to tie their shoelaces by the time they are 6 years old. If you delay teaching children this skill it does impact their independence at school. Some children still can't tie their shoelaces by the age of 9 or 10. Please assist staff in spending time with your child, teaching this important skill.

COVID-19 Guidelines

From the beginning of Term 1 2022, your child's school will operate with a number of COVID-smart measures that have been developed with NSW Health to minimise transmission and keep schools open.

These key measures include:

- ⇒ use of rapid antigen tests by students and staff
- ⇒ ensuring all staff on school sites are fully vaccinated against COVID-19
- ⇒ wearing surgical masks indoors
- ⇒ using cohort arrangements
- ⇒ maximising ventilation

- ⇒ encouraging regular hand washing and continuing enhanced cleaning of schools
- ⇒ strictly limiting visitors on school sites
- ⇒ assessing high risk activities and applying appropriate safeguards
- ⇒ learning from home where face-to-face learning is not possible.

For positive COVID-19 cases

If there is a positive case in your child's class, year or other grouping, your child can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice. If a student or staff member receives a positive RAT test, they need to:

- ⇒ record the positive RAT result through the <u>Service NSW websiteExternal link</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u>
- ⇒ notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible
- ⇒ Follow <u>NSW Health adviceExternal link</u> to isolate for 7 days.

Negative results do not need to be reported to Service NSW or to the school. Schools will inform their community when there is a positive case in the school and guide families on NSW Health advice, including monitoring for symptoms. Parents should expect regular communication with details of any impacted year groups or cohorts.

RAT tests are to be collected by an adult on the Friday of Weeks 3, 5, 7 and 9. These test are advised to be administered on Monday and Wednesday of each week.

Visitors on School Grounds

No parents, carers or visitors will be allowed on school sites until further notice with the following exceptions:

- ⇒ Up to two parents or carers are allowed to accompany their child into school on their first day of Kindergarten or Year 7 or students starting at a new school.
- ⇒ Fully vaccinated essential non-schoolbased staff members, volunteers and thirdparty providers may visit a school to support school operations (such as canteen or uniform shop), curriculum delivery and wellbeing. This includes allied health

services, SRE/SEE and VSA providers, music and sports tutors, and curriculum-based incursion facilitators or educators.

Canteen


