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

Water should be the preferred drink, packed in reusable drink bottles. Under no circumstances should carbonated drinks be brought to school. Moreover, it is imperative that we collectively make a concerted effort to minimise risks to our students, including the packing of nonnut food items and spreads. Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction, when the body's immune system overreacts to a harmless substance, such as food. These substances, known allergens, can trigger life-threatening reactions. Anaphylaxis typically develops within minutes of contact with an allergen, but in some cases, it can occur up to 4 hours The school is mandated to ensure that risk later. management strategies are in place for any student with health concerns, including those at risk of anaphylaxis.

It's important to recognise that anaphylaxis can be triggered through various means, including contamination through breath, touch, and ingestion.

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Therefore, it is crucial that as a community, we take collective responsibility to ensure everyone's safety. In the event of an anaphylactic reaction, it is a serious medical emergency that requires immediate intervention. Therefore, I urge all members of our community to be vigilant and proactive in preventing exposure to allergens and responding swiftly to any emergencies. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to the well-being of all our students.

As we look forward to Easter next week, I am thrilled to witness the creativity of our students on display through their "Eggshibitions". Your efforts are truly impressive, and you should all be proud of your creations.

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Keeping up with Kinder / One / Two

What a wonderful start to the year we have had in the Infants classroom! We are beginning to learn the routines of our school and classroom, and we are proud to share with you.

In English, we have been exploring non-fiction texts. We have thoroughly enjoyed reading *Eric Carle's Book of Amazing Animals* and learning new and interesting facts about animals. We have learned that nouns are words that name people, places and things. We have also learned that adjectives are describing words. We even used magnifying glasses to get up

close and personal with some animals in our



library books, and describe their features. It is fantastic to see Kindergarten learning to read and write their name. We have been using playdoh, letter tiles and whiteboards to practise practise practise. Did you know, Kindergarten are so clever that they already know the sound /m/ and /s/?



In Mathematics, we have started every lesson with a daily review. This is where we use our whiteboards to quickly practise concepts we have already learnt to make sure they move into our long term memory.

Kindergarten have been learning to read and write numbers 1-10 correctly, and are beginning to combine and separate quantities. Stage One are learning ways to add and subtract with speed, and have been identifying and describing 2D shapes.



In Creative Arts this term, we are focusing on photography. We have learned the difference between a portrait and landscape photo; explored self-portraits, and edited our photos using different effects.
